



EDC description

Round 1:

The first round of the Championship, contestants will be divided in four to six groups (depending on the number of entries). Each contestant will deal Black Jack and American roulette for 20 minutes. Per group 4-6 jury members will judge on the contestants.

The jury members will be 'players' at the tables. The jury will not judge participants of their own country. The jury is committed to judge a complete session.

Each jury member will individually judge a contestant without discussing the scores with other judges at his/her table. After each contestant's session the scores will be handed to the Championship Director and the rank per pool will be calculated.

When all contestants have dealt both American Roulette and Black Jack, the winner and runner up per group will be determined by the individual scores. The two highest scoring dealers of each group will enter the semi-finals.

Round 2(semi final):

During round two, 8 or 12 dealers (depending on the number of entrants in round 1) will be divided into two or three groups of four contestants. Each contestant will deal both games for 15 minutes and the two highest scoring contestants per group will enter the finals.

The Final

The two highest scoring dealers per group of round 2 will enter the final.

The procedures at the finals are quite identical to the previous rounds. Each contestant will deal 15 minutes and will be judged by 4-6 jury members. Again, the jury will not judge contestants of their own country.

Participating countries

Each member country of the ECA has the opportunity to enter the Championship with their 'National Dealer Champion' and runner up.
